

<a href="#">Luke 2:25</a>	Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him.
<a href="#">Luke 2:27</a>	Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required,
<a href="#">Luke 4:1</a>	Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness,
<a href="#">Luke 4:14</a>	Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news about him spread through the whole countryside.
<a href="#">Luke 4:18</a>	“The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free,
<a href="#">John 1:32</a>	Then John gave this testimony: “I saw the Spirit come down from heaven as a dove and remain on him.
<a href="#">John 1:33</a>	And I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, ‘The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and remain is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.’
<a href="#">John 3:5</a>	Jesus answered, “Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit.
<a href="#">John 3:6</a>	Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit.
<a href="#">John 3:8</a>	The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit.”
<a href="#">John 3:34</a>	For the one whom God has sent speaks the words of God, for God gives the Spirit without limit.
<a href="#">John 6:63</a>	The Spirit gives life; the flesh counts for nothing. The words I have spoken to you—they are full of the Spirit and life.
<a href="#">John 7:39</a>	By this he meant the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were later to receive. Up to that time the Spirit had not been given, since Jesus had not yet been glorified.
<a href="#">John 14:17</a>	the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you.
<a href="#">John 15:26</a>	“When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father—the Spirit of truth who goes out from the Father—he will testify about me.
<a href="#">Acts 1:5</a>	For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.”
<a href="#">Acts 2:4</a>	All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.
<a href="#">Acts 2:17</a>	“ ‘In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams.
<a href="#">Acts 2:18</a>	Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy.
<a href="#">Acts 5:3</a>	Then Peter said, “Ananias, how is it that Satan has so filled your heart that you have lied to the Holy Spirit and have kept for yourself some of the money you received for the land?
<a href="#">Acts 5:9</a>	Peter said to her, “How could you conspire to test the Spirit of the Lord? Listen! The feet of the men who buried your husband are at the door, and they will carry you out also.”
<a href="#">Acts 5:32</a>	We are witnesses of these things, and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey him.”
<a href="#">Acts 6:3</a>	Brothers and sisters, choose seven men from among you who are known to be full of the Spirit and wisdom. We will turn this responsibility over to them
